Minutemen at the Ready

Greetings, my fellow followers of Jesus the Christ!

After traveling on vacation with my family 3,000 miles in 15 days (with three kids and a wife who would rather fly!) Father God has been speaking to me more about my character (who I am) rather than what I do; "Who am I?" as contrasted with, "What am I supposed to be doing?"

Often people ask me, "Pastor, what am I supposed to do?" Look, I've got to be honest with you; I have no idea what you're supposed to do. However, I do know what you are to be!

The Bible shows us very simply what you/me/we are to be. Micah 6:8 says, "No, O people, the Lord has told you what is good, and this is what He requires of you: to do what is right, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God." It is better for me to know what I am to be, even if I might not be sure about what to do.

Minutemen were American Revolution militiamen who were

> trained to respond to military threats at a moment's notice. They were a unit of the New England colonial militia and were among the first to fight in the war. The term "Minuteman" comes from their ability to be armed and ready to fight in a minute.

These soldiers were

normal everyday men, mostly farmers, they weren't trained and equipped soldiers. However, the sheer number of them and how ready they could be at a moment's notice made them formidable adversaries. It also helped that the men were fighting for what they loved; their land, their home, their family, and the idea of a new country, a free country!

This is how I see the body of Christ. We need to be trained, we need to be armed, and we also need to know what the call to action sounds like. We need to be Christians at the Ready!

I don't believe God is looking for generals, I don't think He's looking for warriors, He's looking for people that would be on this Earth in a peaceful way, a loving way, but at the ready. Ready to move and go and react to the sound of His trumpet. That trumpet, that sound, is the Spirit's voice. What does God want me to be? Ready!

God is showing me that I've been far too concerned in the past with what I'm doing, rather than what I am being. When we focus our attention on what I am to be, rather than what I am to do, it makes us Minutemen and Minutewomen that are ready to jump into action at a moment's notice.

One more thought; the Minutemen weren't just the young strong guys who had powder, ball, and a musket! They had trained together, they studied tactics, they knew their leaders, the knew the local terrain, they knew the commands, etc. "What we prepare for is what we shall get." (WG Sumner)
